Government of Canada supports Ingersoll Downtown BIA through the Tourism Relief Fund

Ingersoll Downtown BIA receives \$77,000 from Ontario's Southwest Regional Tourism Organization through FedDev Ontario to attract visitors and support future growth

February 27, 2023 Ingersoll, ON

The tourism sector is vital to the economy and jobs in Ontario's Southwest. The Ingersoll Downtown Business Improvement Area (IDBIA) supports the downtown merchants through beautifications and promotion of the area as a tourist and shopping destination.

To support these efforts, the Ingersoll Downtown BIA received a non-repayable contribution of \$77,000 from Ontario's Southwest Regional Tourism Organization to support local artists, businesses, youth organizations, non-profits, individuals, professionals and industries. This funding is part of the Government of Canada's Tourism Relief Fund, delivered by the Federal Economic Development Agency for Southern Ontario (FedDev Ontario). Ontario's Southwest received nearly \$11 million from FedDev Ontario to help local tourism organizations and businesses safely welcome back visitors, recover from the impacts of the pandemic and prepare for future growth.

This investment will help Ingersoll Downtown BIA adapt and recover to attract new visitors and drive economic growth in the region.

 Ingersoll Downtown BIA is mandated to oversee the improvement, beautification and promotion of the BIA area as a tourist and shopping destination.

- It is legislated by the Municipal Act, 2001 and governed by a Local Board of Council. A volunteer organization, the Ingersoll Downtown BIA is a volunteer organization, self-funded by a tax levy on local BIA businesses, which is collected by the municipality.
- Ontario's Southwest Regional Tourism Organization works with 10 Destination Management Organizations (DMOs) and tourism industry stakeholders across the region to develop and promote the region of Ontario's Southwest as a vibrant and prosperous tourism region. The Government of Canada's \$500-million Tourism Relief Fund is helping tourism-oriented businesses and organizations recover from the pandemic and prepare for future growth. FedDev Ontario is delivering nearly \$120 million of the Tourism Relief Fund across southern Ontario.
