

Protect yourself from fraud this tax season.

Stay alert.

Remember that the CRA, Town of Ingersoll, or any financial institution will never contact you to ask for your personal or financial information such as passwords, account numbers, or social insurance numbers.

When in doubt, don't click!

If you are unsure you are receiving a fraudulent message, do not click any links. Instead, reach out to the organization claiming to send you messages using their official contact number on their website or app.

Hang up or ignore the call.

If you think you are receiving a fraudulent phone call, hang up or ignore the call, and report it to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre by phone at 1-888-495-8501 or online at reportcyberandfraud.canada.ca.
